3.2.2	Casino host responsibility		
3.2.3	Inducements to gamble	TRSA supports the prohibition of inducements to open an account, which we understand is also the position of the Australian Racing Board when it has provided submissions to Federal Government on Gaming and Wagering.	
3.2.4	Differential regulatory treatment		
3.2.5	Training	TRSA and the racing clubs, contract the SA TAB to provide the operation of and management of the on-course wagering operation. We rely on the SA TAB to provide all race day staff and naturally to ensure they are adequately and appropriately trained and that the SA TAB therefore has the correct and all necessary training processes in place as required in the Code of Practice. We understand that SA TAB does have such systems in place and meets all requirements, and are arguably at the forefront of such. That said, we do appreciate that it is ultimately TRSA's responsibility to ensure such.

3.2.6	Mandatory warning messages	In the Guide the IGA has produced, it has acknowledged that SA TAB has performed very well with regards the advertising requirements. It is important to differentiate between that and sponsorship and sponsors' signage. We do not believe it should be necessary to attach any "warning message" to a sponsor's sign which stops short of being advertising.	
3.2.7	In-venue reporting of problem gamblers		
3.2.8	Perimeter control	TRSA is not in favour of the perimeter controls as referred to in the IGA's Guideline document. These would be impractical in terms of racing and TAB's, with potentially significant impact for no gain.	
3.2.9	Mandatory breaks in play (pop-up messaging)		
3.2.10	Sportsbetting advertising	This has also been referred to above, under "Mandatory warning messages". We would be opposed to any action which would change the present policy or position as to the racing industry being able to continue to show the normal dividend indicators as to all runners in all races, prior to the event being run.	
3.2.11	Consolidating the wagering codes	We do not have a strong view as to whether the wagering codes should be consolidated, other than to say they should be consistent, easily understood and not open to various interpretations. In racing's case particular attention would be required as to the requirements of and compliance with the code by interstate operators.
